cultivation of tobacco farmers. All participants should be committed in the conference of the parties (COP)-4 in Uruguay. By the grace of God, We shall be able to fulfill our demands.

Former Secretary and Adviser of Ahsania Mission Cancer Hospital Mohammad Ali presided over the seminar while General Secretary of Bangladesh Anti Tobacco Alliance and founding president of MANAS Prof. Dr. Arup Ratan Choudhury were present as special guest.

While presenting an article on Conference of the Parties (COP)-4, Coordinator of Dhaka Ahsania Mission Iqbal Masud said, Cigarettes worth at 40.5 billion Dollars are sold across the world through illegal trading. As a result cost of cigarettes is decreasing and demand is increasing and country is being hampered by economically. The Gang of international illegal trading is very active. Conference of Conference of the Parties (COP)-4 is going to be held in Uruguay on November 2010. Adviser to the Prime minister for Health and Family Welfare and Vice Chairman of Conference of the Parties (COP)-4 Dr. Syed Modasser Ali being Bangladesh representative to this conference is expected to play a strong role in tobacco controlling.

While presenting an investigation report on Illicit Trade of tobacco products in Bangladesh, Senior reporter of The Financial Express F.H.M Humayun Kabir Said, huge amount of tobacco products smuggled into Teknaf from Maungdaw port of Myanmar across the Naf river. Marking Hazrat Shajalal international airport as an another gateway for cigarette smuggling he also said, Cigarettes of foreign brand and tobacco products are being sold rampantly in different places of the capital city like Nilkhet, Elephant road, Gulshan-1, Gulshan-2, Baridhara, Shamoly, Newmarket, Shabag and Utra. Cigarettes of different brand are being imported for duty-free sale. But the companies are selling in open market evading government taxes.

Vice-chairman of Anti Tobacco Alliance Barrister Tania Amir, President of Consumers Association of Bangladesh (CAB) Quazi Faruq and Legal Adviser of Campaign for Tobacco Free Kids Mr. Aaron Schwid Participated in discussion.

The discussants said, illegal traders are selling cigarettes in Bangladesh market which were prepared for duty free-sale of another country. Tendu patabidi's are being sold rampantly to the poor smokers in border area while Barmij churuts are being sold in different areas in Dhaka and Chittagong. Bangladesh government losing Tax and young generation becomes addicted in tobacco smoking. Every year 57,000 people die and 4,30,00,000 people being affected indirectly in Bangladesh due to use of tobacco.

Mainstreaming of graduated students of NFE with FE is essential

Mainstreaming of graduated students of non-formal education (NFE) with formal education (FE) is essential. For attainment of same standard of learning of students through NFE with the mainstream, equivalence in education system is now a demand of the time.

Dhaka Ahsania Mission's (DAM) UNIQUE Project, in cooperation with European Union (EU), is going to implement a pilot project on equivalence education in selected learning centres from January next year. This programme will be implemented in Mirpur, Kaliganj and Kapasia areas for attainment of necessary skill, effectiveness, usefulness and testing the standard of equivalence education. In the meantime, a plan has been developed



for implementation of this programme.

Speakers said this at a two-day workshop on a system for bringing equivalence in non-formal education and formal education at Dhaka Ahsania Mission's Lakeside office on November 27, 2010. Giving emphasis on extension of non-formal education in new National Education Policy, speakers further said, a study on possibility of equivalence

education was conducted at joint initiative of World Bank and Primary and Mass Education of Education Ministry in 2004. In 2007, at joint initiative of UNESCO and Dhaka Ahsania Mission a recommendation was made on the structure of equivalence education. Dhaka Ahsania Mission, under supervision of Non-Formal Education Bureau and in cooperation with UNESCO, is going to take the pilot

Self-learning Plus Training-2010

DAM is implementing 'Improvement of Quality Education Project with the financial and technical support of Plan Bangladesh. It has been aimed at improvement of slow learners of Class-3 to Class-5 and builds a strong base of students of Class-1 and Class-2 in 29 primary schools. Like every year this year also, a three-day self-learning training was held for the teachers of CAMP and community, to improve the quality of education and make joyful learning to the students. The manager of IQE project, DAM, Shripur, Gazipur-M Zahangir Hossain inaugurated the training course. Technical Officer of IQE project, DAM, Shripur, Gazipur, Md Shafiuddin Khan co-ordinates the Self-learning Plus course.

Resource trainers were the assistants of this course. In 6 batches, 37 camp community teachers, 72 Shopan community teachers and 15 community resource persons were trained self-learning plus training in the Mymensingh GSS training centres in the last week of August 2010.
