

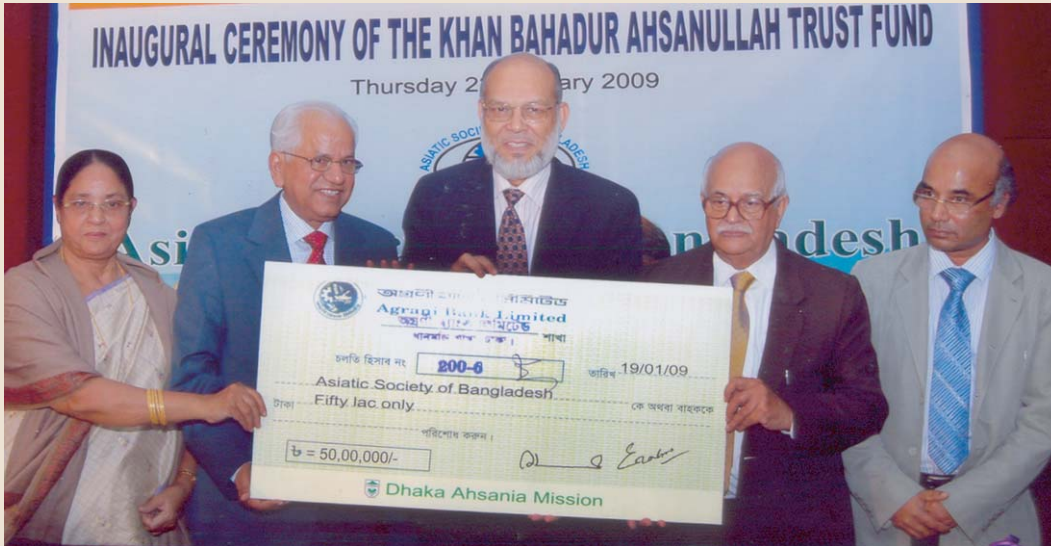

New lifeline for marginalised students

THE millennium development goal (MDG) calls for universal primary education by 2015. The effort towards universal elementary education in Bangladesh is really making impressive progress. But we are still facing severe deficiencies in the quality of primary education. This is because of gradual marginalisation of the government primary schools.

However, a joyful learning technique introduced jointly by teachers and community people of Sreepur upazila in Gazipur district is a case of reversing the situation. It is part of an innovative project titled, "Improvement of Quality Education (IQE)," undertaken in 2005. Within a span of three years, the project has significantly contributed to halt marginalization of primary school students in the upazila. Dalia Becoming Empowered

Dalia was born in 1982 in a rural village named Islampur of Barisal district. Her father Md Sekendar Ali Bapari was a fruit seller. He had died when Dalia was 7 year old. After 6 months of her father's death, her mother came to Dhaka. Because she (mother) had no way to maintain the expenses of herself including 2 sons and 3 daughters. She managed one room for shelter in Dhaka at a rent of Tk 1,500 at Khilgaon slum. But she did not know how she will bear the expenses of her family and how to meet the rent of the room. She started work as a maid servant and she gave Dalia a house for doing work. The house owner used to provide food three times to Dalia but she did not get any wage for work, because she was too young. After 5-6 months, Dalia's mother admitted her to a free of cost school advised by one person, Dalia continued her education up to class VIII. She could not enroll after class VIII because there was no provision after class VIII at that school. Now she is 25 years old. Meanwhile, Dalia's mother arranged marriage for her when she was 17 year old. After marriage **[See page 3]**

NGO's. He also said, anti-drug seminars will be arranged very soon in the 4 district towns of 4 divisions. On behalf of the representatives of NGO's, Dhaka Ahsania Mission (DAM) President Kazi Rafiqul Alam handed over this declaration to Directorate of Narcotic Control DG Humayun Kabir.

DAM President Kazi Rafiqul Alam said, instead of scattered activities for drug control by the NGO's across the country, anti-drug program can be turned into a movement with the joint efforts of NGO's and Narcotic Control Directorate officials at the districts level. Mass awareness will have to be created against drug addiction along with rehabilitation of drug addicts in the society through detoxification and rehabilitation program. Unless this is done, drug addicts will incite friends and relatives to take drugs which will cause further greater damage to the society. He sought total cooperation of law enforcing agencies in anti-drug activities. He said, Vienna Anti-drug declaration-2008 representing more than 5 hundred NGO's of 116 countries across the globe will contribute greatly in the

UN drug policy activities.

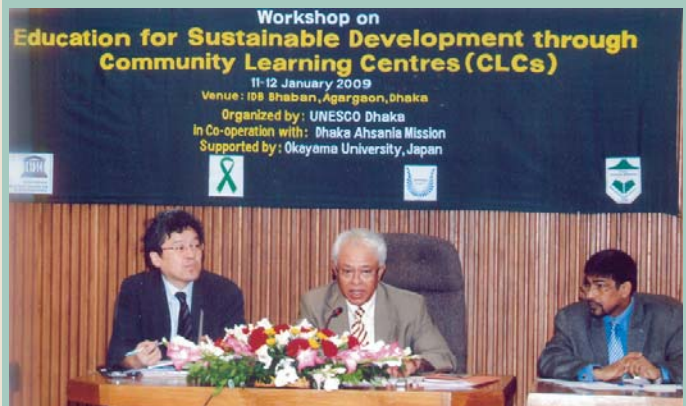

While speaking as chief guest former Vice-Chancellor of Jahangirnagar University Professor Zillur Rahman Siddiqui said, DAM has opened a unique chapter in the socio-economic development of Bangladesh. He said, not only in education but also in the health service sector DAM is contributing significantly and for this they have also received due recognition at home and abroad.

Highlighting the significance to establish the Khan Bahadur Ahsanullah Trust Fund in the year of golden jubilee of DAM, Dhaka Ahsania Mission President Kazi Rafiqul Alam said, the institution which has the capacity to perform a particular type of work, should be given scope to do that type of work and added there is little scope of doing research in Bangladesh at present. In that respect, researchers and members of the Asiatic Society with their expertise and knowledge in their respective fields can change the lot of the mass-people of Bangladesh by contributing in the planning of pragmatic programmes and their implementation, he wished.

Asiatic Society of Bangladesh President Professor Sirajul Islam presided over the ceremony which was attended as chief guest by former VC of Jahangirnagar University Professor Zillur Rahman Siddiqui. DAM President Kazi Rafiqul Alam also addressed the gathering. DAM Executive Director M. Ehsanur Rahman spoke on the life and works of Khan Bahadur Ahsanullah while the address of welcome was delivered by Asiatic Society of Bangladesh General Secretary Professor Mohfuza Khanam. Dhaka Ahsania Mission has donated Taka fifty (50) lac in this fund. The profit from this Trust Fund will be utilized for theoretical and practical research on Arts, Humanities, Social Science and Science. Razabari, Prohladpur, Gosinga and Maona. Around 3,564 children of 48 primary schools are its direct beneficiaries. Community Learning Centres (CLCs) are established under the project. The main objective of CLC is to help create a conducive atmosphere of education in the school arena. CLCs are used as alternative education centres where students develop their reading habit. Daily newspapers and monthly, quarterly magazines, storybooks, novels and other child-friendly books are available in the centres. A total of 862 readers come to 24 CLCs in four unions of Sreepur Upazila regularly. A two-year school development programme is undertaken. It has been aimed at achieving admission of 100 per cent children, increasing attendance of students, raising awareness among guardians, organising guardians' meeting and rally. Members of village development committee, teachers, school management committee, guardians and Union Parishad members are involved in school development planning and its materialisation.

Marginalised students who could not accommodate themselves in the new environment of schools spend morning or afternoon on supportive study activities. Extra classes are held before or after school hours according to convenience. Marginalised children are involved in the activities according to age group titled, 'Sopan' and 'Camp' classes. Teachers teach dull children of classes from one to five with love and care with the help of attractive educational materials. They never rebuke them. Examinations are held every month. Every month children's parents attend meetings to know their children's progress. In the process, dull students strengthen their learning skills. Now, 2,726 children are benefited through 106 Sopan centres in 49 schools.

Camp learning activity is a community-based learning programme designed to meet the special learning needs of third graders to fifth graders. Eight hundred thirty-eight slow learners are being benefited through 44 camp learning centres in 31 primary schools. Twelve community teachers work alongside primary school teachers while seven hundred seventy-four pupils are direct beneficiaries. At present, the activities are going on in eight primary schools. The impact of IQE programme is evident from the great improvement in the children's scores over the years. In 2007, pass rate was 84 per cent in Rajbari union while in Prohladpur union it was 77 per cent which is much more compared to those of previous years. The rate of enrolment has increased by 100 per cent in the project area. The innovative project is being implemented jointly by Dhaka Ahsania Mission (DAM) and Plan Bangladesh.

Now she is very happy because she is getting average Tk. 9,200 per month for her work. Now she can lead her family better then before. Need for more than 10 thousand medical technologists in the country



At present, more than 10 thousand medical technologists are needed in the country. Every year, 2 thousand 5 hundred doctors, 1 thousand 3 hundred nurses and only 5 hundred medical technologists get the degrees. National Professor Dr. M.R. Khan said this while inaugurating the Ahsania Mission Institute of Medical Technology (AMIMT) on Saturday (3 January 2009) at its own campus in the capital.

He further said, there is scope of

skilled medical technologists even outside the country. The scope of medical technology education following the health ministry approved curriculum created by Dhaka Ahsania Mission (DAM) would be considered as a milestone in the history of medical technology teaching in the country, he said.

Birth Registration of working children

With the support of NFE Bureau, Dhaka Ahsania Mission has been implementing "Basic Education for Urban Working Children" project in Demra, Sutrapur, Zatrabari, Shempur thanas and Wards nos 76, 77, 82, 83, 88, 89, 90 of Dhaka City Corporation, Narayangong Sadar and Fatullah thanas. Besides, giving education skill-development of children is one of the objects of the project.

With the financial and technical cooperation of UNICEF and NFE Bureau, the coordinator of the project has taken a two day-long training and subsequently he imparted training to the project supervisors on birth registration. The workers of the project collected forms from the Zonal Office of the City Corporation and completed registration of about 2500 children covering 36 and 65 education centers consecutively of Sutrapur and Shampur thana under Dhaka City Corporation. Registration of about 1150 children have been completed and registration is under process to cover about 4000 children of 8 centers of Fatullah thana, 18 centers of Zatrabair, 16 education centers of Shampur and 4 centers of Demra thana in the Union and Municipal Corporations besides city corporation area under this project.
