DAM launches new project in Mongla

Dhaka Ahsania Mission (DAM) has launched a new project titled, 'Improved Food and Livelihood Security in Context of Increased Disaster Risk and Climate Change' in Mongla upazila of Bagerhat district.

The project started in March, 2009 and will end in February, 2011. It is being funded by CAFOD UK. The project aims to

improve food and livelihood security in Bagerhat district in the context of increased disaster risk and climate change. The expected output of the project are as follows:

1. Household level income and retainable assets of target families in Mongla upazila are increased through environmentally sustainable agro-fishery, livestock and alternative livelihoods practices.
2. Food production in Mongla upazila increased through use of

sustainable farming methods by small-scale and marginal farmers.

3. Advocacy initiatives on livelihood security and climate change issue are strengthened and have visible results.

4. Target beneficiaries (including women headed households, people with disabilities, PLWHAs and Union Disaster Management Committees (UDMCs) are better prepared for disaster and have demonstrated their capacity in disaster management.

5. Good coordination between partners enables learning to be shared and disseminated at partner and government level with academic institutions between CAFOD and sister agencies and in DRR/Climate change networks.

Besides DAM, CARITAS, ADD and PRODIPAN are implementing the project. PRODIPAN is leading

in attaining output no 1, CARITAS is leading in attaining output 2, ADD is leading in achieving output 3 and DAM is leading in achieving output 4.

Under the project, DAM will undertake field research and analysis to establish case for advocacy, advocacy initiatives on climate change/disaster prevention issues at national/international level, development of communication and media materials on DRR and climate change in Bagerhat district, training to UDMCs on development of disaster mitigation plans, using disaster management information from partners and BUET, provide training and workshop on disaster preparedness and mitigation at community level to prevent loss of lives and livelihood.

members of local implementing partner NGOs. Duration of the training course was five days with accommodation facilities. The objectives of the training was to develop staff capacity to play their due role in achieving improved hygiene behaviour/practices, promote community-led total sanitation and increased coverage of safe water supply services. The activity delivery mechanism was demand-driven approach with financial assistance from HYSAWA Fund as well as through more supply-driven activities supported by the Local Government Support Unit (LGSU). HYSAWA Fund has been providing financial support to

eligible Union Parishad for implementation of the project. We believe that through this training support and planned activity, implementation process will accelerate improved and sustainable hygiene behaviour/practice, access to sanitation facilities and its proper use, access to safe water source and safe water use increased in the participating communities of the project area. Through this intervention two (4 & 7) of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) to reduce by two-thirds mortality rate among children under five and by half the proportion of people without sustainable access to safe drinking water will be achieved.

Satkhira, Jessore, Narsindi and Netrakona region from March 2009. Under EFRRAP scheme, beneficiaries of MFP will be receiving credit support for Disaster preparedness, Tubewell installation and repair and Livelihood restoration through initiating IGA. Facilities will be provided to repay the loan in soft installments in two years with a sufficient grace period. The rate of interest is 4%. Within May 2009, MFP targeted to disburse an amount of Tk. 40 lacs in its different working area under this scheme. Beneficiaries of MFP have responded spontaneously for the scheme as it will be very useful for them before rainy season and possible floods.

Dhaka Ahsania Mission established 32 CRCs in rural areas to promote ICT at rural level with a view to reducing the rich and poor gap in this field. As a part of the programme, local CRCs are organising discussion meetings with school students and teachers to draw their attention and sensitise them on benefits of ICT.

The government of Bangladesh has been introducing computer education at high school level but due to lack of technical expertise, the teachers are reluctant to use computer at schools. As CRCs are playing an effective role in promoting ICT at rural level, they



are organising discussion meetings in schools.

Participants discuss about ICT facilities such as computer training, digital form from government departments, gathering basic information, internet service, skill training, knowledge of CD display for children and livelihood information for farmers. Students also ask questions to clarify ICT

in education.

Jalal Uddin, a senior teacher of Barbari High School presided the discussion meeting held at Barbari High School while Nurul Islam, President of Paglakanai Madhukori CRC participated. A large number of teachers and civil society members of the locality took part and shared ideas on benefits of ICT in education.
