Literacy rate up by 27.2 pc only in 35 years

Literacy rate has gone up by 27.2 % only in 35 years across the country. Now is the time to take various steps for attainment of cent per cent literacy by the year 2014. Enrolment in primary schools has been raised to 90%. Ten per cent learners either do not attend school or do not get the opportunity for schooling. Rate of school dropouts is 49.9%.

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of Bangla are far ahead than others. These children are much more creative than others.

In his presidential speech, Dhaka Ahsania Mission President Kazi Rafiqul Alam said, this is because of only Bangla as medium of education, the rate of schooldropouts is larger among the children belonging to ethnic community. This is the main reason of lack of interest in education among these children resulting in non-fulfilment of a desired result of primary education. UNESCO Bangladesh Representative Malama Meleisa said, UNESCO is actively helping children belonging to ethnic community to pursue education in mother language in 12 countries including Bangladesh, India, Nepal and Thailand. Work on this study in

Bangladesh has been undertaken as part of a regional study programme. CAMPE Chairman and Dhaka Ahsania Mission President Kazi Rafiqul Alam presided over the seminar while UNESCO Bangladesh Representative Malama Meleisa was present as special guest.

DAM Research Division Deputy Director Rafiq Hasan presented a report on the outcome of the study. 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the European Commission held at Mirpur Urban Training Centre in the city on Tuesday, 23 February, 2010.

Under Unique Project, about 1 lac 59 thousand 460 children who are deprived of education and living in Char (sandy land rising above the river bed), Haor (water body), coastal islands, hill region, Monga-prone areas and city slums are being rendered non-formal education by following the government curriculum, speakers further said. These children usually fell victims of circumstances due to certain geographical location and bad communication system. After rendering non-formal education, these children are being brought to the mainstream of education. Apart from this, Unique Project has set up 2380 learning centres where multigrade system is being followed to teach the learners.

Suravi Director Md Abu Taher presided over the advocacy meeting titled, 'Prospects and Problems in Attainment of Quality Primary Education'. Ershad Uddin Ahmed, Education Officer of Lalbag Thana in Dhaka presented the key-note speech while Manikganj District Primary Education Officer Shaheen Ara Begun was present as chief guest. Dhaka Ahsania Mission Training and Material Development Division Director M A Rashid was present as special guest. Besides, Unique Project Coordinator Golam Faruque Hamim and Regional Manager Shamima Begum also spoke on the occasion.

DAM along with Concern Universal is helping the local community in 14 unions of Mirzaganj upazila in Patuakhali district and Patharghata upazila in Barguna district in building effective preparedness to face the consequences of recurrent disasters and minimise loss to lives and property.

The programme has been incorporated with the agenda of 1,576 learning centers run under UNIQUE Project, a major educational project of DAM, in the disaster prone regions of Rangpur, Mymensingh, Dhaka, Barisal, Noakhali, Chittagong and Rangamati.

Activities under this initiative will continue till September 15, 2010. Around 2 lakh people of disaster prone districts have been brought

under the project.

The novelty and uniqueness of the initiative is that local community, union parishad (UP), secondary schools, learning centres and Ganokendro (people's welfare centres operated by DAM), government and non-government organisations have been involved with its activities while all the institutions are working in close coordination with each other.

Project activities include discussion, development of risk reduction action plans for vulnerable areas, education material for school children containing awareness messages on disaster, training module on Disaster Management Committee (DMC), handout package for DMC training, manual on post disaster care, volunteers' guide, posters on disaster preparedness, flyers and festoons containing awareness messages on

disaster preparedness, simulation models on cyclone and floods and simulation focusing role of schools and students in disaster risk reduction.

A team consisting of 14 Dhaka-based journalists of print and electronic media went to Charkhali village under No-4 Deuli Subidkhali union of Mirzaganj upazila in Patuakhali district on Sunday (February 22, 2010) to witness a community based disaster risk reduction simulation exercise there. No-4 Deuli Subidkhali union, Samabae Secondary School, local Ganokendro known as people's centers jointly organized the one hour long simulation exercise as part of ongoing efforts to strengthen disaster risk reduction at the village level. Held at Charkhali Samabae (Cooperatives) Secondary School, the simulation exercise has proven to be a success. It has created great enthusiasm among local people. The villagers were highly impressed by

the extra-ordinary performance of school students of the rural area.

Mirzaganj upazila chairman Gazi Athar Uddin Ahmed, vice-chairman Abu Bakar Siddiquee, woman vice-chairman Jesmin Sultana Jui, Deuli Subidkhali Union Parishad (UP) chairman Mobarak Ali Munshi and Charkhali Samabae Secondary School headmaster Golam Mostafa Khan graced the occasion. Government will take necessary measures for detection of cancer at all community clinics across the country. Steps will also be taken for proper training to create

skilled manpower in this field.

State Minister for Health and Family Welfare Dr Capt (ret'd) Majibur Rahman Fakir, MP, said this while speaking as chief guest

at a seminar held on the occasion of World Cancer Day at Dhanmondi Mission Bhaban auditorium in the city on 4 February 2010.

The State Minister stressed on concerted efforts of government and non-governmental organisations to create awareness about cancer. Awareness is the best way for prevention of cancer, he said.

Speakers said, in Bangladesh, 60 % cancer patients die within five

year. At present, cancer mortality rate is 8%. The rate will rise to 13% within next 20 years. If usage of CFC, contraction of ozone sphere continue at the present state then an additional 10 crore people is likely to fall victims of skin cancer within next 50 years. About 4.5 crore people will suffer from various problems relating to eyesight.

In his presidential speech, Kazi Rafiqul Alam said, Ahsania Mission Cancer Hospital will be commissioned at the initial stage by the yearend. He said, Health Education Bureau of government should take initiative to create awareness on cancer. Ahsania Mission Cancer Hospital will extend cooperation according to its might. There are only 105 cancer specialists in this country of 15 crore population. Government's cooperation is a must for creating cancer specialists, he said.

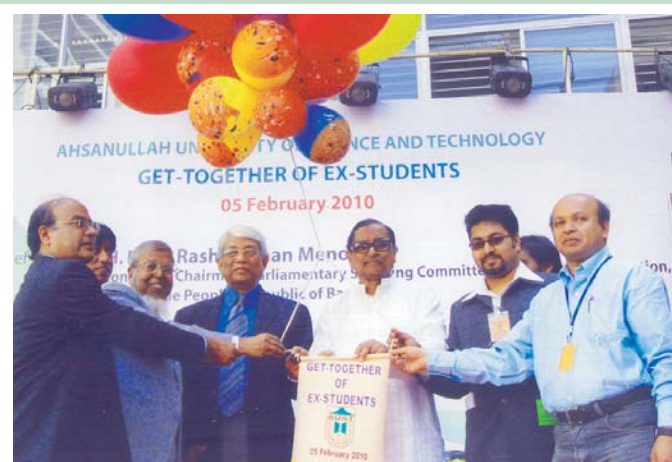
ECD pre-requisite for ensuring quality edn
