

to the idea of developing skill manpower to cater to the demand of the people at the grass roots level. As part of that for literacy and life-skill development of the poor women, DAM has taken up the project titled 'Literacy and Livelihood Training for the House Maids'. The aim of this project is to develop working literacy skill of jobless poor people and give them practical training of house-keeping. For implementing the project, two literacy and life-skill development curriculum have been developed in a national workshop after analyzing data gathered through a survey.

On the basis of that developed curriculum, a package for literacy has been developed which includes 3 primers for learners, 1 education support guide book and 16 video flip. Recently with the financial and technical support of Commonwealth of Learning (COL) this package materials have been published by Training and Materials Division.

This course has been developed keeping the marginal standard saved by national education curriculum. The subjects of this course are totally house-hold work based. It may be mentioned, C.R. Mushib and Dr. Momon Kumar Mandal of Netaji Subash Open University, West Bengal of India have given valuable suggestions in finalizing the course. Any NGO can use this package materials.

plot of 3 acres in sector-10, Uttara of Dhaka. When it is completed with a cost of Tk. 256 crore, this 500-bed world class cancer hospital will have a total area of about 5.5 lac sft. Uptil now 10 storeys of this 13 storied tower building have been completed. So far Tk. 54 crore 80 lac has been received as donation. A further amount of Tk. 56 crore 57 lac is in the process of donation. Uptil now Tk. 52 crore 16 lac have been spent.


