Project: Drop-in-Centre for Street and Working Children in Dhaka City (DiC) II-Mohammadpur.

Objectives:
Build the self esteem among the street and working children to develop them responsible citizen.

Education sector

Achievement

- The environment of DIC is very neat and clean
- 181 children enrolled up to August '22 (yearly target 200)
- During visiting period (August '22), 149 children out of 181 remained in DIC),
- On average 57 children attend in the DIC per day (in the visiting 2 days and previous 3 days).
- On average 53 children have taken Lunch in the DIC per day.
- No discrimination founds in lunch distribution process.
- Children satisfaction level on quality of food is good.



Education sector

Achievement

- 171 children enrolled in education program, average attendance rate is 41 39%
- 134 children received individual counselling services 223 times from January to July-2022
- From January to July 2022, 171 children received health services 902 times
- Satisfaction level on health services is good.
- Recreational sessions are regular, the children performed dances and songs well.



Education

Achievement

- Awareness and issue based meetings regular,
- Awareness level of early marriage, definition of the children and basic
- rights is up to the mark

 All children were found with short nail and hair
- 4 out of 9 children visited are engaged in jobs and their average monthly income is 4500/-.
- 88 children have been involved in the savings scheme till the visiting period, Total Savings 17869/-.
- Stock register and relevant registers are updated



Education

Areas that need to be improved/revised

- MGTL approach is not effective in DIC, so learners performance is not up to the mark.
- Awareness level on steps of hand washing and child rights are not up to the mark.
- Out of 30 children, 9 had scabies, 3 had oral sore and one had leg sore
- 11.6% malnourished children in the DIC.
- The process of counselling is not maintaining properly and the change are not marking properly
- Life skills and vocational trainings are yet to be done.

Health and WASH sector Project: Strengthening advocacy for comprehensive amendment of Tobacco Control Law and increase tobacco tax

Objectives:

- To run a campaign engaging policymakers and relevant stakeholders to support TC law amendment (specially to incorporate provisions in the TC law to ban DSA, product display at POS, single sticks sale and E-cigarettes ban by 2022)
- To engage policymakers and influencers to support increasing tax and price on tobacco products in FY 2022-23
- 3. To run a comprehensive media campaign to support TC law amendment and increase tobacco tax and price

Health and WASH sector Policymakers/stakeholders engagement for TC law amendment

- A list of policy makers /stakeholders has been updated with short biography.
- One to one meeting has been done with 3 Ministers and 12 MPs.
- Honorable Ministers and MPs expressed their commitment to work on law amendment.
- Small group follow-up/ Sensitization meetings with retailer associations have been conducted



Health and WASH sector

cont-----

- A combined meeting has been conducted with 110 members of different retailers' associations. antitobacco organizations and Journalists.
- Honourable Commerce Minister joined as the Chief Guest.
- Chief Guest committed to take initiatives to remove cigarettes from the "Essential commodity list in Essential commodity act- 1956"
- TC law amendment (draft) is uploaded on the website ministry of health, DAM mobilized 2068 people to submit comments on supporting the draft law.





Health and Support for increasing tax and price on tobacco WASH sector products:

- A letter (call for action) signed by DAM President and sent to all 350 MPs.
- Project team visited 12 MPs, 3 honourable MPs talked in the budget session in parliament in favour of increasing tobacco tax
- Human chain organized, in favour of tobacco tax and price increase, 120 people from different level participated.
- 04 Facebook posts were boosted and one of post received 88,222 likes.



Health and WASH sector

Media coverage for TC law amendment and increase law

- 2 press conference organized, 120 journalists attended in the conference.
- 26 OP-EDs published on TC Law amendment and Tobacco Tax
- 719 media reports were published
- A lot of Social Media posts were generated.


Areas that need to be accomplished/revised

- Advocacy meeting with NBR chainman.
- Relationship with NBR needs to be more strengthen.
- 1 notice is circulated. Need to circulate 2 more notice for the implementation of LG common guideline and Tobacco Control Law.
- 02 small group meetings with relevant ministries involved in law amendment committee were under progress till September 2022.






CC& DRR sector 1144 sqft on 4th floor of Municipality has been provided for establishment of training academy. Academy Set-up is under construction. 420 Sqft brick tin shed for preparing hollow brick is established following the design. 50 Participants received hands-on job on Jute Goods(target 45). 50 Participants received hands-on job on Hollow brick((target 45)). 3 auto sewing machine provided for each group (10 members). Visited 2 groups, except one nobody operate the machine. The satisfaction level of the trainees is not satisfactory for Jute Goods

Achievement

- During February-October 2022, the net income from own VTI initiative training is 84,250/-
- During February-October 2022, the net income from RPL is 38,283/-
- During February-October 2022, Graduated 28 from Uttoran project, all of 28 received certificates.
- Material list has been prepared in the VTI.
- Stock and other registers are ok, and they match with reality.

TEVT Sector

Need to be improved

- Out of the drop-out 02 in Uttaron project, one trainee has secured pass marks, but was shown dropped.
- Material distribution of EHCLB project was delayed, some equipment yet to be delivered.
- 04 out of 06 multimedia projectors were found stored in the store room, and they may become non-functional.
- During February-October 2022, no trainee was enrolled from project.
- DIP was not found in VTI Pallabi.

Recommendations/Opinions

- PMS and conventional monitoring will run in parallel/single which is more effective.
- Renaming termed Monitoring Unit as MEAL Unit
- Introduce RBM (Result Based Monitoring)
- Separate guideline will be needed for conventional monitoring/single guideline for PMS and conventional monitoring

Cont.---

- Start the online base data collection process and reporting
- DAM founding aims, philosophy and core values should be included in monitoring indicators
- Monitoring data should be converted into resourceful information for decision making
- Develop a Core Monitoring Group for monitoring.

Cont.----

- Financial year's budget should have consistency with the monitoring framework/plan.
- DAM Monitoring system's SWOT analysis is needed considering national, international and UN organization
- Guideline will be reviewed through a half day workshop
- Guideline will be reviewed following the Scope of work and ToR (draft).
